No. S.R.O. 24-L/83.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 203 of the Air Force Act, 1953 (VI of 1953), and in supersession of all instructions made in this behalf, the Government is pleased to make the following regulations, namely:—

1. **Short title.**—These regulations may be called the Bangladesh Air Force Officers (Individual Staff Studies Course) Regulations, 1983.

2. **Definitions.**—In these regulations, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

- (a) "Course" means the Course specified in regulation 3;
 (b) "Examination" means the Individual Staff Studies Course, Part I or, as the case may be, Part II Examination; and
 (c) "President" means the President of the invigilating Board constituted under regulation 10.

3. **The I.S.S.C. Examination.**—(1) Unless exempted by these regulations, no officer who holds a permanent commission or short service commission or special purpose short service commission or extended service commission in the Bangladesh Air Force, other than its Medical Branch, shall be eligible for promotion to the substantive rank of Flight Lieutenant or Squadron Leader unless he has passed the Individual Staff Studies Course Examination as under:

- (a) promotion to the substantive rank of Flight Lieutenant. Individual Staff Studies Course Part I Examination.
 (b) promotion to the substantive rank of Squadron Leader. Individual Staff Studies Course Part II Examination.

(2) The phasewise subjects and duration of the Part I and Part II Course under sub-regulation (1) shall be as shown below:

(3) The Part I Course under sub-regulation (2) shall be introductory and the Part II Course under the said sub-regulation shall be advanced and extensive.

4. **Eligibility to take part in the Course.**—(1) All officers completing two years of commissioned service on or before the date of commencement of the Course shall be eligible to take part in the Part I Course.

(2) All officers completing six years of commissioned service on or before the date of commencement of the Course shall be eligible to take part in the Part II Course.

5. **Commencement of the Course and detailing of Officers.**—The Course shall commence on the 1st January each year and the Air Secretary's Branch shall detail the officers by the 30th November each year.

6. **Nominal rolls.**—The Directorate of Education of Bangladesh Air Force shall prepare the nominal rolls of officers eligible for each Course and shall fix the tentative date for each Examination for each centre by the 15th November each year and shall send the nominal rolls to the Air Secretary's Branch at Air Headquarters for detailing of officers. The officers of various Branches shall be shown separately.

7. **Study materials.**—(1) The study materials of each phase shall be self-contained and shall be provided to the selected officers in a number of booklets which shall include study notes, questions and exercises with answers or suggested solutions so as to enable them to check their solutions themselves.

(2) Tutor-assessed exercises of all the nine phases shall be submitted to the authority concerned with the Course by such dates as may be specified in this behalf for assessment and comment.

(3) Detailed guidelines of each Course shall be available in the "Introduction to Individual Staff Studies Course" and shall be issued by the Officer Commanding the Course to selected officers.

8. **Pass standard.**—To pass an Examination, a candidate shall obtain at least sixty per cent marks in that Examination.

9. **Appearance in the Examination.**—(1) An officer shall get three chances to clear each part of the Examination for promotion to the substantive rank of Flight Lieutenant or, as the case may be, Squadron Leader before completion of the period of service required for such promotion.

(2) An officer who clears the Examination in the manner provided in sub-regulation (1) shall be promoted with effect from the date from which he becomes eligible for such promotion, and an officer who fails to clear accordingly but subsequently clears it shall be promoted with effect from the date of Examination he qualifies.

10. **Invigilating Board.**—The Officer Commanding Bases under whose jurisdiction an Examination shall be held shall constitute an Invigilating Board for the Examination centre with the following:

- (a) an officer of the rank of Wing Commander who shall be the President; and
- (b) two officers for the first fifteen candidates and an additional officer for every additional ten candidates.

11. **Despatch of question papers.**—The question papers for an Examination shall be despatched direct to the Base Commanders in sealed packages. The packages shall bear the mark "I.S.S.C. phase No., Part I and I.S.S.C. No., Part II Examination". The seal on the packages shall be broken only by the President five minutes before the commencement of the Examination.

12. **Examination procedure.**—(1) The Officer Commanding Bases under whose jurisdiction the Examination shall be held shall furnish to the President the instructions for Invigilating Board and nominal rolls of the candidates who are due to appear in the Examination at their centres and ensure the following:

- (a) no officer whose name is not on the roll shall be permitted to appear in the Examination;
- (b) candidates shall report twenty minutes before the time fixed for Examination;
- (c) no candidate shall be admitted to the Examination room on the expiry of half an hour after the Examination begins;
- (d) members of the Invigilating Board shall be present during the Examination, only one member may, however, be absent at a time;
- (e) discretion for allowing candidates to leave the Examination room shall rest with the President;
- (f) a member of the Invigilating Board shall be responsible for ensuring that the candidates' names, Course index numbers and signatures are entered on the front page of the answer scripts; and
- (g) at the end of the Examination, the answer scripts shall be placed unfolded in large envelopes and marked "CONFIDENTIAL" and "TO BE OPENED BY THE OC ISSC" with the following information on the cover page:
 - (i) I.S.S.C. Examination Phase No. and Part No.
 - (ii) Examination Centre
 - (iii) Signature of the President

(2) The president shall be responsible for seeing that the envelopes are securely fastened and sealed and that they are despatched to OC, ISSC, soonest.

13. **Examination reports.**—Proceedings of Invigilating Board shall be recorded in Form 2 and be forwarded to the Directorate of Education, Air Headquarters. The President shall make the following to that Form, namely:—

- (a) a certificate giving the following informations:
 - (i) the conditions mentioned in regulation 12 have been strictly observed;
 - (ii) all members of the Invigilating Board were present according to these regulations during the Examination; and
 - (iii) none of the candidates received improper assistance during the Examination; and
- (b) a nominal roll, listed branch-wise mentioning the ranks, names, personal numbers and Course index number of the candidates.

14. **Exemption.**—(1) The officers seconded or attached from the Bangladesh Army or Bangladesh Navy shall be exempted from taking part in the Course and Examination.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, the Government reserves the right to promote any officer who, for exceptional circumstances, has not been able to take part in the Course and to appear in the Examination:

Provided that no promotion under this sub-regulation shall be unless recommended by the Chief of Air Staff.

No. S.R.O. 25-L/83/Misc-3/81(Poll-IV)/51.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of section 9 of the Manoeuvres, Field Firing and Artillery Practice Act, 1938 (V of 1938), the Government is pleased to authorise the carrying out of field firing and artillery practice throughout the area (Faujdarhat Halishahar Range in the district of Chittagong) defined in this Ministry's Notification No. S.R.O. 269-L/82/Misc-3/81(Poll-IV)/411, dated the 10th July, 1982, and described in the Schedule below, during the period from the 6th February, 1983, to the 18th February, 1983:

No. S.R.O. 26-2-L/83/10(3)Admn. IX/78.—In pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the Chief Martial Law Administrator is pleased to make the following amendment in the Principal Appraisers and Appraisers (Customs Department) Recruitment Rules, 1980, namely:—

In the aforesaid Rules, in the Schedule, against Sl. No. 3 in column 1, for the entries in columns 4 and 5, the following shall respectively be substituted namely:

- “(a) 50% by direct recruitment; and (a) *For direct recruitment.*—At least Second Division/Class Bachelor’s degree from a recognised university, relaxable up to Third Division/Class Bachelor’s degree in the case of a person who has obtained at least Second Division both in the Secondary School Certificate and Higher Secondary Certificate Examinations,
- (b) 50% by promotion from amongst the Examining Officers of Customs and when none of them is found suitable for promotion,—
- (i) 35% by promotion from amongst the Preventive Officers; and

- (ii) 15% by promotion from amongst the Office Superintendents, Deputy Office Superintendents and Stenographers of Customs Department:

Provided that when none of the persons belonging to one category is found suitable for promotion, the vacancy in the quota reserved for that category, may be filled up by promotion from amongst the persons belonging to another category and when none of the persons belonging to either category is found suitable for promotion, the vacancy may be filled up by direct recruitment.

- (b) *For promotion.*—(i) In the case of Examining Officers of Customs, Preventive Officers and Stenographers, at least 5 years' service in the respective posts; and

- (ii) In the case of others as well as the Preventive Officers and the Stenographers must have passed the Departmental Promotion Examination.

Explanation.—For the purpose of the entry at (b) (ii) above, the Office Superintendents shall be as a class senior to the Deputy Office Superintendents and the Deputy Office Superintendents shall be as a class senior to the Stenographers. In each class the eligible officials shall have their seniority as obtained in their own class.

No. S.R.O. 27-L/83/10(1) Admn. IX/79.—In pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the Chief Martial Law Administrator, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

1. **Short title.**—These rules may be called the Gazetted Executive posts (Narcotics and Liquor Department) Recruitment Rules, 1983.
2. **Definition.**—In these rules unless the context otherwise requires:
 - (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes any officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to such post;
 - (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
 - (c) "probationer" means a person appointed on probation to a specified post;

- (d) "recognised university" means a university established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other university declared by the Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised university for the purpose of these rules;
- (e) "requisite qualification" in relation to a specified post, means the qualification laid down in the Schedule in relation to that post;
- (f) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules; and
- (g) "Specified post" means a post specified in the schedule.

3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule, appointment to a specified post shall be made—

- (a) by direct recruitment,
- (b) by promotion, or
- (c) by transfer on deputation.

(2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has the requisite qualification and subject to such orders as may be issued by the Government in the case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age limit laid down in the Schedule for that post:

Provided that the upper age limit may be relaxed in the case of a person who has already been appointed to a specified post on *ad hoc* basis by such period as he may have been holding the post continuously as an *ad hoc* appointee.

4. **Appointment by direct recruitment.**—(1) Appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made upon the recommendation of the Commission based on written examination or such test as may be conducted by it for the purpose.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment, if he—

- (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh, or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in, Bangladesh; and
- (b) is married to, or has entered into a contract of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made until,—

- (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director of Health Services or the Civil Surgeon to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the specified post; and
- (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

(4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to a specified post unless—

- (a) he has applied in such form accompanied by such fee and before such date as was notified by the appointing authority while inviting applications for the specified post; and

- (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he has applied through his official superior.

5. Appointment by promotion.—(1) Appointment by promotion to a specified post shall be made on the recommendation of such Selection Board or Departmental Promotion Committee as the Government may constitute in this behalf:

Provided that appointment by promotion to a specified post of higher class shall be made on the recommendation of the Commission.

(2) A person shall not be eligible for appointment by promotion to a specified post if he has unsatisfactory records or service.

6. Probation.—(1) Person selected for appointment to a specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation,—

(a) in the case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of appointment; and

(b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

(2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory, or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period,—

(a) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service; and

(b) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

(3) After the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority—

(a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (4), confirm him; and

(b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory may,—

(i) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service; and

(ii) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

(4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in a specified post until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as the Government may, from time to time, prescribe by order.
