No. S.R.O.34-L/75/IF.V/18/72-Pt.-IV.693—In exercise of the powers conferred by Article 15 of the Bangladesh Coinage Order, 1972 (P.O. No. 83 of 1972), read with Article 6 thereof, the Government is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

The standard weight of 5, 10 and 25 poisha Bangladesh Coins, with special slogans and designs coined under the provisions of Article 4 of the said Order and the remedy allowed in the making of such coins shall be as specified below:—

Denomination.	Weight.	Remedy allowed.
5 poisha ..	1.40 Grammes	1/40th by weight.
10 poisha ..	2.00 Grammes	Ditto.
25 poisha ..	2.65 Grammes	Ditto.

No. S.R.O.35-L/75 IF.V/18/72-Pt.-IV-694.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Article 4 of the Bangladesh Coinage Order, 1972 (P.O. No. 83 of 1972) the Government is pleased to determine that Bangladesh coins of the denominations of 5, 10 and 25 poisha with special slogans and designs hereafter to be coined

at the Mint for issue under the authority of the Government shall conform to the following dimensions, designs, and composition, namely:—

### Dimensions and Metal.

### Designs

#### 5 Poisha:

##### Obverse.

##### Reverse.

Obverse of 5 poisha coin shall comprise an elevated outer rim with the National Emblem placed inside it. The National Emblem consists of the National flower Shapla (nymphaea nouchali) resting on water, having on each side an ear of paddy and being surmounted by three connected leaves of jute with two stars on each side of the leaves.

The coin shall consist of an outer rim in high elevation with a plough in the centre surrounded by a cog wheel. The slogan উৎপাদন বাড়ান (Grow More) shall be inscribed by cutting into the lower part of the wheel so as to show only the outer line of the wheel at the bottom. The inscriptions "Bangladesh" and "1974" above the plough and the denominational value 5 poisha (5 in numeral and poisha in words) shall appear below it placed inside the wheel. All inscriptions and numerals shall be in Bengali. All the features mentioned above shall be executed in reasonably high relief.

**10 Poisha :**

**Obverse.**

Obverse of 10 poisha coin shall comprise an elevated outer rim with the National Emblem placed inside it. The National Emblem consists of the national flower Shapla (nymphaea nouchali) resting on water, having on each side an ear of paddy and being surmounted by three connected leaves of jute with two stars on each side of the leaves. In addition there shall be some patterns along the scallops inside the rim.

**Reverse.**

The design shall consist of an elevated outer rim with a tractor at the centre, a Jute plant with 3 leaves on each side and 3 grains of paddy appearing on the left of the tractor. The slogan **সবুজ বিপ্লব** (Green Revolution) shall appear immediately below the tractor, and The inscriptions "Bangladesh, 1974" shall appear above the design mentioned and the denominational value shall appear below the slogan. The denominational value '10' in numeral shall be placed immediately below the slogan and the value in words shall be written on either side of the numeral '10' in a manner that 'ten' shall appear on the left and 'poisha' shall appear on the right, sandwiching the numerical value 10. All scripts and numerals shall be in Bengali. All the features shall be executed in reasonably high relief.

**25 Poisha :**

**Obverse.**

Obverse of 25 poisha coin shall comprise of an elevated outer rim with the National Emblem placed inside it. The National Emblem consists of the National flower Shapla (nymphaea nouchali) resting on water, having on each side an ear of paddy and being surmounted by three connected leaves of jute with two stars on each side of the leaves.

**Reverse.**

It shall contain an outer elevated rim with the designs of a fish, an egg, a bunch of two bananas and a pumpkin placed in sequence at the centre of the coin with the slogan **সবর জন্য খাদ্য** (Food for All) inscribed immediately below them. The inscription "Bangladesh" and "1974" shall appear above these designs and the denominational value shall appear below the slogan. The value in numeral '25' shall be placed centrally below the slogan with denominational value in words written on either side with 'twenty five' appearing on the left and 'poisha' appearing on the right sandwiching the value "25" in numerals. All the scripts and numbers shall be in Bengali. All the features above shall be executed in reasonably high relief.

The existing 5, 10 and 25 poisha coins shall continue to be legal tenders.

No. S.R.O. 36-L/75/IF-V/III/73-685.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Article 4 of the Bangladesh Coinage Order, 1972 (P. O. No. 83 of 1972) the Government is pleased to determine that coins of the denomination 50 poisha hereafter to be coined at the Mint for issue under the authority of the Government shall conform to the following dimensions, designs and composition, namely—

50 poisha	Coper-Nickel Zinc Alloy.	22.00	Round	Milled with 120 serrations.

## Designs.

## Obverse.

Obverse of the 50 poisha coin shall comprise an elevated outer rim with a series of small hemispheric dot patterns running alongside the inner edge of the rim in a circle with the National Emblem placed inside it. The National Emblem consists of the National flower 'Shapla' (*Nymphaea Nouchali*) resting on water having on each side an ear of paddy and being surmounted by three connected leaves of jute with two stars on each side of the leaves.

## Reverse.

The reverse of the coin shall comprise an elevated outer rim with a series of small hemispheric dot patterns running alongside the rim in a circle with the design of a pigeon in the centre. The inscriptions "Bangladesh" and "1973" shall appear above the pigeon and the denominational value in numerals "50" below it. The denominational value shall also be written on either side of the numeral "50" in words, "fifty" appearing on the left and "poisha" on the right. Two bunch of floral patterns, each comprising of five petals shall also appear one on each side of the pigeon. All the letterings and numerals shall be in Bengali. All the features mentioned above shall be executed in reasonably high relief.

No. S.R.O. 37-L/75/IF-V/III/73-684.—In exercise of the power conferred by Article 15 of the Bangladesh Coinage Order, 1972 (P. O. No. 83 of 1972), read with Article 6 thereof, the Government is pleased to make the following rule, namely:—

The standard weight of 50 poisha coins, coined under the provisions of Article 4 of the said Order and the remedy allowed in the making of such coins shall be as specified below:—

Denomination.	Standard weight.	Remedy (Not exceeding).
50 poisha	4.00 Gr.	1/40th by weight.

**No. ED/AI-28/75-59.**—The Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh announce with profound regret the sudden and untimely death of Mr Md. Abul Kashem Khan, Deputy Secretary, Ministry of Finance on the 14th January, 1975 at the P. G. Hospital, Dacca, from illness.

2. Mr Md. Abul Kashem Khan was born on 1st October, 1927. He was appointed Deputy Magistrate and Deputy Collector on 12th March 1954 on the results of the then East Pakistan Civil Service Examination. He had served as Additional Subdivisional Officer, Chittagong and Assistant Director, Basic Democracies, Kushtia. In consideration of his meritorious services he was promoted to the senior scale of the erstwhile CSP on the 30 September, 1969 and appointed Additional Deputy Commissioner, Noakhali. In 1971 he joined the Bangladesh Government at Mujibnagar and actively participated in the liberation war. Immediately after liberation he was appointed Deputy Commissioner of Rangpur district. Through his untiring efforts and dedicated service he restored the administration of that district which had been seriously affected during the war of liberation. Thereafter he held other important assignments including that of Additional Commissioner, Rajshahi Division. He also held charge of the post of Commissioner of Rajshahi Division. He went to U.S.A. for a six-month training course in 1974. On his return he was appointed Deputy Secretary in the Ministry of Finance. This was his last assignment.

3. The Government of Bangladesh convey their sincerest condolences and heartfelt sympathies to the widow of late Mr Md. Abul Kashem Khan and other members of the bereaved family and wish that his soul may rest in eternal peace.
