No. S-VII/1(20)74/80.—Government have been pleased to constitute a National Labour Advisory Board as under:—

Composition :

- (i) The Minister for Labour and Social Welfare, Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh—*Chairman.*
- (ii) Ten representatives of the Government.
- (iii) Five representatives of the employers to be selected by Government in consultation with the most representative organisations of the employers in the country.
- (iv) Five representatives of the workers to be selected by Government in consultation with the most representative organisations of the workers in the country.

2. Additional representatives of employers and workers, to represent the interest left out with reference to the agenda of any particular meeting, may be invited subject to the condition that the number of representatives of the employers shall be equal to that of workers.

3. The functions of the Advisory Board will be to advise the Government on such matters relating to labour-management relations, labour policy, labour laws, etc., as may be referred to it for advice.

4. The Board shall ordinarily meet at least once a year, at such place as may be decided by the Government. The Chairman may, however, call for any special or emergent meeting of the Board as and when considered necessary.

5. Ordered that this Resolution be published in the *Bangladesh Gazette*.
