No. S.R.O. 103-L/75/208/D/Cus/75.—In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (c) of section 21 of the Customs Act, 1969 (IV of 1969) and in supersession of its notification No. S.R.O. 73/D/Cus/72, dated the 12th December, 1972, the National Board of Revenue is pleased to authorize repayment to the extent specified in column (3) of the table below of Customs duties paid on the importation of the raw materials specified in column (1) of the said table and used in the production or manufacture of the goods specified in column (2) thereof, subject to the following conditions, namely:—

- (i) The goods have been manufactured according to the formula duly furnished to the National Board of Revenue showing the quantity of various imported raw materials specified in column (1) of the said table and used in the production or manufacture of the goods specified in column (2) thereof.
- (ii) The manufacturer maintains proper record of the goods manufactured in accordance with the formula referred to in sub-paragraph (1) and produces, on demand, such records and other evidence as may be required by the National Board of Revenue to satisfy itself that the imported raw materials have been used in accordance with the formula.
- (iii) The manufactured goods are exported out of Bangladesh and an application for repayment of Customs duties is presented to the proper officer of Customs within 60 days of such exportation or of the publication of this notification, whichever is the later.

- (iv) The exporter makes a declaration on the reverse of the original shipping bill or other export documents to the effect that he would claim repayment of the Customs duties paid on the imported raw materials used in the production of the goods being exported.
- (v) The repayment at the rate specified shall be allowed provided that the goods exported are manufactured with the same constituents on which the rate of repayment is notified and the manufacturer-cum-exporter shall immediately intimate to the National Board of Revenue and the Directorate of Inspection and Training (Customs and Excise), Dacca,—
- (a) any change in the prices of the imported raw materials,
- (b) any changes in the composition of the manufactured goods to be exported, and
- (c) use of any indigenous raw materials in place of the imported raw materials.

2. The repayment authorized by this notification shall be admissible in respect of the goods exported on or after the 24th September 1973.

No. S.R.O. 104-L/75/103-E.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service (First) Commission as required by clause 2 of Article 140 of that Constitution, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

1. **Short title.**—These rules may be called *Gazetted Officers (Town Planning Section of the Building Directorate) Recruitment Rules, 1974.*

2. **Definitions.**—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context:—

- (a) "appointing authority" means the Government;
- (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service (First) Commission;
- (c) "Directorate" means the Building Directorate;
- (d) "Probationer" means a person appointed on probation to a specified post;
- (e) "requisite qualification", in relation to a specified post, means the qualifications laid down in the Schedule in relation to the post;
- (f) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules; and
- (g) "specified post" means a post specified in the schedule.

3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of the schedule, appointment to a specified post shall be made:—

- (a) by direct recruitment; or
- (b) by promotion from amongst persons already holding specified posts or other posts mentioned in the schedule for the purpose.

(2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has requisite qualification, and in the case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age limit, if any, laid down in the schedule for that post.

4. **Appointment by direct recruitment.**—(1) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment, if he:—

- (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh, or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in, Bangladesh;

Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of a person who is already in the service of the Republic:

Provided further that the President may authorise the appointment of a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh on temporary basis;

- (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made until:—

- (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the specified post; and
- (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

5. **Appointment by promotion.**—(1) No appointment to a specified post by promotion shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment by promotion to a specified post if he has not passed the Departmental examinations within the period specified in sub-rule (3) of the rule 6.

6. **Probation.**—(1) Persons selected for appointment to a specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation;—

- (a) in the case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and
- (b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment;

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation in the case of any person by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

(2) Soon after the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority:—

- (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall, subject to the provision of sub-rule (3), confirm him; and
- (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may, in the case of the direct recruitment, terminate his service, and, in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

(3) A probationer shall not be confirmed in a specified post until he has passed such Departmental examinations as the Government may, from time to time, direct within a period of:—

- (a) four years from the date of substantive appointment in the case of a person appointed by direct recruitment; and
- (b) three years from the date of such appointment in the case of a person appointed on promotion;

Provided that in the case of a person who is holding a specified post and has not passed the Departmental examinations, he shall pass such examinations within the period mentioned in this sub-rule or within two years from the date of coming into force of these rules, whichever is later.

(4) If a probationer during the period of his probation including the extended period, if any, fails to pass the Departmental examinations within the time specified in sub-rule (3), the appointing authority may:—

- (a) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate the service of the probationer, and
- (b) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

Must have a Master's Degree/Post-Graduate Diploma in Physical Planning/Town Planning/Urban and Regional Planning/Civic Design from a Bangladesh or foreign University with at least 5 years' experience as Town Planner;
OR

Must have a Ph.D. Degree in Physical Planning with at least 2 years' practical experience as a Town Planner.

3 Administrative and Assistant Town Planning Officer. Not less than 30 years.

(i) 50% by promotion from amongst the Planning Assistants in the Directorate.

(ii) 50% by direct recruitment.

(i) For promotees:—

(a) At least 5 years' experience as Planning Assistant in the Directorate; and

(b) Must have at least a Second Class Master Degree in Economics/Geography/Sociology/Social Welfare/Statistics from a Bangladesh University, or a diploma-in-Architecture or Town Planning from any Institute in Bangladesh recognised by the Government or an equivalent Diploma.
