No. S. R. O. 205-L/83/178/Cus.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 19 of the Customs Act, 1969 (IV of 1969), and in supersession of this Division's Notification No. S.R.O 233-L/82/725/Cus., dated the 30th June, 1982, the Government is pleased to exempt the goods specified in column (2) of the Table below and falling within the Tariff Heading Nos. of the First Schedule to the said Act as specified in column (1) of the Table, from so much of the customs-duties leviable thereon as is in excess of the rate specified in the corresponding entries in column (3) of that Table.

No. 243-L/82/738/Cus., dated the 30th June, 1982, the Government is pleased to exempt wet blue (semi-finished) leather from so much of the customs-duty leviable on export thereof as is in excess of 5% and $2\frac{1}{2}$ %, as the case may be, of the amount which would represent the value for export purposes on the following conditions, namely:—

- that the exporter is a recognised manufacturer and exporter of finished crushed leather or leather goods;
- (2) that he is registered as an exporter of the goods mentioned in clause (1) with the office of the Chief Controller of Imports and Exports;
- (3) that he will be entitled to get exemption in excess of 5% export duty if he has effected export of finished leather or leather goods by 20% in terms of quantity in the year preceding the year of exports; or
- (4) that he will be entitled to get exemption in excess of 2½% export duty if he has effected export of finished leather or leather goods by 50% in terms of quantity in the year preceding the year of export;
- (5) that the Collector of Customs of the competent jurisdiction is satisfied that the aforesaid increase has actually been effected;
- (6) that the exporter-cum-manufacturer, at the time of export, declares on the bill of export of finished crushed leather or leather goods that he will claim the benefit of exemption of export duty on wet blue leather;
- (7) that the exporter shall maintain a register of the export of finished crushed leather or leather goods for the purpose of this Notification and entry in respect of each consignment of export of finished crushed leather or leather goods will be made therein and shall get it duly verified and signed by an officer of customs not below the rank of a Principal Appraiser;
- (8) that at the time of export of wet blue leather on which this special rate of 5% or 2½% is claimed by the exporter, the necessary documents mentioned at clauses (6) and (7) shall be submitted to the Collector of Customs of the competent jurisdiction; and
- (9) that the exporter-cum-manufacturer shall undertake to abide by such conditions and procedures as may be laid down by the Collector of Customs of the customs-stations through which the export has been effected and the Collector of Customs under whose territorial jurisdiction the industrial unit is located.

No. S.R.O. 213-L/83/786/Cus—In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of section 21 of the Customs Act, 1969 (IV of 1969), and in supersession of this Division's Notification No. S.R.O. 154-L/82/716/Cus., dated the 20th May, 1982, the National Board of Revenue is pleased to authorise the delivery without payment of so much of the customs-duties charg able thereon as is in excess of 10% ad valorem, in case of goods specified in Annex-I and 20% ad valorem, in case of goods specified in Annex-II and imported up to the limit of annual entitlement under the relevant Import Policy Order by a manufacturer approved by the Director of Drugs Administration, Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, for manufacture of pharmaceutical products.

- (a) that the licensed manufacturer declares at the time of import of such materials upon which repayment of customs-duty shall be claimed on the body of bills of entry submitted for clearance of such goods;
- (b) that the licensed manufacturer enters the imported raw materials into the raw material register and observe other formalities as provided for under Excises and Salt Rules, 1944;
- (c) that the licensed manufacturer shall, within 180 days from the date of payment of customs-duty on the imported raw materials, submit claim for repayment of customs-duty supported by certificate issued by an Excise Officer not below the rank of Assistant Collector of the jurisdiction in which his factory is situated and proof of payment of excise-duties to the Collector of Customs, Custom House through which the imported goods have been originally cleared;
