No. S.R.O. 401-L/76/25.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 37 of the Excise and Salt Act, 1944 (I of 1944), the National Board of Revenue is pleased to make the following further amendments in the Excises and Salt Rules, 1944, namely:—

In the aforesaid Rules,—

(1) for the heading above rule 96-GGG the following shall be substituted, namely:—

“E2A-Products of Leather, Plastic and Rubber Materials—Footwear”;

(2) in rule 96-GGG,

(a) throughout the rule, except in the title and sub-rule (1) the word “leather” wherever occurring shall be omitted;

(b) in the title, for the word “leather” the words and commas “leather, cellophane, plastic or resin materials and of rubber, synthetic or artificial rubber” shall be substituted;

(c) for sub-rule (1) the following shall be substituted, namely:—

“(1) This rule shall apply to footwear made wholly or partly of leather, cellophane, plastic or resin materials and of rubber, synthetic or artificial rubber and manufactured without the aid of power, steam or gas”;

(d) after sub-rule (2), the following new sub-rule shall be *inserted*, namely:—

“(2-A) Notwithstanding anything contained elsewhere in these rules, the duty on footwear to which this rule applies, shall be paid in the manner prescribed hereinafter in this rule.”; and

(e) after sub-rule (16), the following new sub-rule shall be *added*, namely:—

“(17) The provisions of rule 9 saving the powers of the Collector under the second proviso thereof, 52, 52-A, 52-B, sub-rules (1) and (3) of rules 224, 228, 228-A and 229 shall not apply footwear to which this rule applies or to the manufacturer of such footwear.”;

(3) in Appendix-I,—

(a) in the description of Forms in series Nos. 66-A and 79-B, the word “leather” shall be *omitted*;

(b) in the Forms PCL-1, PPL-1, PPL-2 and TPL-1, the word “leather” wherever occurring shall be *omitted*;

(c) in the Forms PPL-1 and PPL-2, for the word “value” wherever occurring the following shall be *substituted* namely:—

“Value/Retail price”; and

(d) for the Form RTL-1, the following shall be *substituted*, namely:—
