Dacca, the 13th February, 1981

No. S.R.O. 59-L/81.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission as required by clause (2) of article 140 of that Constitution, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

THE GAZETTED OFFICERS (MINISTRY OF WOMEN'S AFFAIRS) RECRUITMENT RULES, 1980

- 1. Short tiltle.—These rules may be called The Gazetted Officers (Ministry of Women's Affairs) Recruitment Rules, 1980.
- Definitions.—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—
 - (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes any officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to such posts;
 - (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
 - (c) "Probationer" means a person appointed on probation to a specified post;

- (d) "recognised university" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by the Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised university for the purpose of these rules;
- (e) "requisite qualification" means the qualification laid down in the Schedule in relation to a specified post;
- (f) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules; and
- (g) "Specified post" means a post specified in the Schedule.
- 3. Procedure for recruitment.—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule and instructions relating to reservation for the purpose of clause (3) of article 29 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, appointment to the specified post shall be made by the appointing authority—
 - (a) by direct recruitment; or
 - (b) by promotion; or
 - (c) by transfer on deputation.
- (2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has the requisite qualification and, in the case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age limit laid down in the Schedule for the post:

Provided that the upper limit of age may be relaxed in the case of a person who has already been appointed to a specified post on ad hoc basis, by such period as he may have been holding the post continuously as an ad hoc appointee.

- 4. Appointment by direct recruitment.—(1) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.
- (2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment, if he—
 - (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh, or a permanent resident of Bangladesh: Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of a person who is already in the service of the Republic;
 - (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.
- (3) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made until-
 - (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by an authorised medical officer appointed, or by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of such posts;
 - (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

- (4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to any of the posts, unless-
 - (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Commission while inviting application for the specified posts; and
 - (b) in case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, be applied through his official superior.
- 5. Appointment by promotion.—(1) Appointment by promotion to a specified post shall be made on the recommendation of such Departmental Promotion Committee as the Government may constitute in this behalf:

Provided that the Commission shall be consulted in the case of a promotion to a higher class.

- (2) A person shall not be eligible for appointment by promotion to a specified post if he has unsatisfactory records of service.
- 6. Probation.—(1) Persons selected for appointment to a specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation—
 - (a) in case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and
 - (b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation in the case of any person by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

- (2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period-
 - (a) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service; and
 - (b) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.
- (3) After the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority-
 - (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory shall, subject to the probations of sub-rule (4), confirm min, and
 - (b) if it is of the opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may-
 - (i) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his services; and
 - (ii) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.
- (4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in any of the posts until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as Government may, from time to time, direct.

THE GAZETTED OFFICERS (DEPARTMENT OF WOMEN'S AFFAIRS) RECRUITMENT RULES, 1980

- 1. Short title.—These rules may be called The Gazetted Officers (Department of Women's Affairs) Recruitment Rules, 1980.
- 2. Definitions.—In these rules unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—
 - (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes any officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to such posts;
 - (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
 - (c) "Department" means the Department of Women's Affairs;
 - (d) "Probationer" means a person appointed on probation to a specified post;
 - (e) "recognised university" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by the Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised university for the purpose of these rules;
 - (f) "requisite qualification" means the qualification laid down in the Schedule in relation to a specified post;
 - (g) "Schedule" means the schedule annexed to these rules; and
 - (h) "specified post" means a post specified in the schedule.
- 3. Procedure for recruitment.—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule and instructions relating to reservation for the purpose of clause (3) of article 29 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, appointment to the specified post shall be made by the appointing authority—
 - (a) by direct recruitment; or
 - (b) by promotion; or
 - (c) by transfer on deputation.
- (2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has the requisite qualification and, in the case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age limit laid down in the Schedule for the post:

Provided that the upper limit of age may be relaxed in the case of a person who has already been appointed to a specified post on ad hoc basis, by such period as he may have been holding the post continuously as an ad hoc appointee.

- 4. Appointment by direct recruitment.—(1) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.

- (2) A person shall not be eligible for appointment by promotion to a specified post if he has unsatisfactory records of service.
- 6. Probation.—(1) Persons selected for appointment to a specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation—
 - (a) in case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and

(b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation in the case of any person by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

- (2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer, the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period,-
 - (a) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his services; and
 - (b) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.
- (3) After the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority,-
 - (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule, confirm him; and
 - (b) if it is of the opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may-
 - (i) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service; and
 - (ii) in the case of promotion revert him to the post from which he was promoted.
- (4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in any of the posts until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as Government, may, from time to time, direct.

No. S.R.O. 61-L/81.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 7 of the Sales Tax Act, 1951 (III of 1951), the Government is pleased to make the following further amendments in the Ministry of Finance Notification No. 9, dated the 27th June, 1951, namely:—

In the aforesaid Notification,

- (i) for item 40 and the entries relating thereto the following shall be substituted, namely:—
- "40. Alkatra excluding asphalt (bitumen).
- Explanation.—"Asphalt" means petroleum bitumen, including rock or lake asphalt with or without mineral matter, either prepared mechanically or occurring naturally possessing characteristic agglomerating properties and substantially soluble in carbon disulphide, including emulsions containing only water, asphaltic bitumen and emulsifying agents."; and
- (ii) for item 96 and the entries relating thereto the following shall be substituted, namely:—
 - "96. All petroleum products excluding asphalt (bitumen).
 - Explanation.—"Asphalt" means petroleum bitumen, including rock or lake asphalt with or without mineral matter, either prepared mechanically or occurring naturally possessing characteristic agglomerating properties and substantially soluble in carbon disulphide, including emulsions containing only water, asphaltic bitumen and emulsifying agents."

NATIONAL BOARD OF REVENUE

ORDER

Dacca, the 10th February, 1981

- No. S.R.O. 62-L/81/622/Cus —In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (c) of section 21 of the Castoms Act, 1969 (IV of 1969), the National Board of Revenue is pleased to authorize the repayment to the extent specified in column 4 of the table below of customs-duties paid on the importation of the raw materials specified in column 2 of the said table and used in the production or manufacture of the goods specified in column 3 thereof, subject to the following conditions, namely:-
 - (f) The goods have been manufactured according to the formula duly furnished to the National Board of Revenue showing the quantity of various imported raw materials specified in column 1 of the said table and used in the production or manufacture of the goods specified in column 3 thereof;
 - (ii) The manufacturer maintains proper record of the goods manufactured in accordance with the formula referred to in sub-paragraph (i) and produces, on demand, such records and other evidence as may be required by the National Board of Revenue to satisfy itself that the imported raw materials have been used in accordance with that formula:
 - (iii) The manufactured goods are exported out of Bangladesh and an application for repayment of the customs-duties is presented to the proper officer of customs within 60 days of such exportation or of the publication of this order, whichever is later;
 - (iv) The exporter makes a declaration on the reverse of the original shipping bill or other export documents to the effect that he would claim repayment of the customs-Juties paid on the imported raw materials used in the production of the goods being exported; and
 - (v) The repayment at the rate specified shall be allowed provided that the goods exported are manufactured with the same constituents on which the rate of repayment is authorised and the manufacturer-cum-exporter shall immediately intimate to the National Board of Revenue and the Directorate of Inspection and Training (Customs and Excise), Dacca-
 - (a) any change in the process of the imported raw materials,
 - (b) any change in the composition of the manufactured goods to be exported, and
 - (c) use of any indigenous raw materials in place of the imported raw materials.
- 2. The repayment authorized by this order shall be admissible in respect of the goods exported on or after the 23rd June, 1980.
