#### NOTIFICATION

#### Dhaka, the 30th March, 1983

No. S.R.O. 115-L/83.—In pursuance of the Proclamation of 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, and in supersession of all existing rules in this regard, the Chief Martial Law Administrator is pleased to make the following Rules, namely:—

- 1. Short title.—These rules may be called the Audit and Accounts Officer, Deputy Assistant Military Accountant General, Deputy Assistant Controller of Military Accounts and Superintendent [Civil/Military/Post, Telegraph and Telephone (Audit and Accounts Department)] Recruitment Rules, 1983.
- 2. Definitions.—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—
  - (a) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
  - (b) "recognised University" means a university established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other university declared by the Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised University for the purpose of these rules;
  - (c) "requisite qualification" in relation to a specified post, means the qualification laid down in the Schedule in relation to that post;
  - (d) "Schedule" means the schedule annexed to these rules; and
  - (e) "specified post" means a post specified in the Schedule.

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- 3. Procedure for recruitment.—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule, appointment to a specified post shall be made—
  - (a) by direct recruitment; or
  - (b) by promotion.
- (2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has the requisite qualification and, in the case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age limit laid down in the Schedule for the post.
- 4 Appointment by direct recruitment—(1) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.
- (2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment, if he—
  - (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh, or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in, Bangladesh;
  - (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.
- (3) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made until-
  - (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director General of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the specified post; and
  - (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.
- (4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to a specified post unless—
  - (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the specified post; and
  - (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he applied through his official superior.
- 5. Appointment by promotion.—(1) Appointment by promotion to a specified post shall be made on the recommendation of the Commission.
- (2) A person shall not be eligible for appointment by promotion to a specified post if he has unsatisfactory records of service.
- 6. Confirmation.—(1) Persons selected for appointment to a specified post shall, at the first instance, be appointed temporarily and may be confirmed as and when substantive vacancies are available.
- (2) A person shall not be confirmed if he has unsatisfactory records of service.

- 7. Apprenticeship.—(1) A person appointed by direct recruitment to the post of superintendent shall remain on apprenticeship for such period and on such pay and allowances as may be determined by the Government.
- (2) A superintendent on apprenticeship shall not be appointed to the post of superintendent on regular basis unless and until he passes the Subordinate Accounts Service or Subordinate Military Accounts Service Examination conducted by the Comptroller and Auditor General.
- (3) A superintendent on apprenticeship failing to pass the Subordinate Accounts Service or Subordinate Military Accounts Service Examination conducted by the Comptroller and Auditor General within the specified period may be appointed to the post of auditor if he accepts such appointment; otherwise, his appointment as superintendent on apprenticeship shall be terminated.
