

Dacca, the 30th June, 1980

No. S.R.O. 209-L/80.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Imports and Exports (Control) Act, 1950 (XXXIX of 1950), the Government is pleased to make the following further amendment in the Licences and Permits Fees Order, 1958, namely:—

In the aforesaid Order,-

(a) in clause 3, in sub-clause (1), for the full stop at the end a semi-colon shall be substituted and thereafter the following shall be added, namely:—

"Provided that if the import is made jointly by a group of importers, the fee payable shall be determined on the basis of share of the individual importer and not on the total licence value of the group"; and

- (b) in the Schedule, for entry 2 the following shall be substituted, namely:--
 - For letters of credit, licences or permits over Tk. one lakh:

- (a) 2% ad valorem for the first Tk. one lakh; and
- (b) 3% ad valorem for the amount exceeding the first Tk. one lakh".

No. S.R.O.210-L/80.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Imports and Exports (Control) Act, 1950 (XXXIX of 1950), the Government is pleased to make the following further amendment in the Registration (Importers and Exporters) Order, 1952, namely:—

In the aforesaid Order, in clause 21, in sub-clause (1), for entries 1 and 4 in the first column and the entries relating thereto in the corresponding columns the following shall respectively be substituted, namely:—

"1. Commercial importers Tk. 400.00 Tk. 400.00

4. Exporters Tk. 150.00 Tk. 25.00".

No. S.R.O.211-L/80,—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission as required by clause (2) of article 140 of that Constitution, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:

THE LIBRARIAN (O & M WING LIBRARY) RECRUITMENT RULES, 1980.

- Short title.—These rules may be called the Librarian (O and M Wing Library) Recruitment Rules, 1980.
 - 2. Definitions.—In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - (a) "appointing authority" means the Government;
 - (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
 - (c) "probationer" means a person appointed on probation to the post;
 - (d) "post" means the post of Librarian in the O & M Wing of the Establishment Division;

- (e) "recognised University" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by the Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised University for the purposes of these rules;
- (f) "requisite qualification" in relation to the post, means the qualification as laid down in the schedule; and
- (g) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules.
- 3. Procedure for recruitment.—(1) Appointment to the post shall be made by direct recruitment on the recommendation of the Commission.
- (2) No person shall be appointed to the post unless he has the requisite qualification and he is also within the age limit specified in the Schedule.
- 4. Appointment.—(1) No person shall be eligible for appointment to the post if he—
 - (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh;
 - (b) is married to a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.
 - (2) No appointment to the post shall be made until-
 - (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post; and
 - (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.
 - (3) No person shall be recommended for appointment to the post unless-
 - (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date as was notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the post; and
 - (b) in the case of a person already in the Government service or in the service of a local authority, he has applied through his, official superior.
- 5. Probation.—(1) A person selected for appointment to the post shall be appointed on probation for a period of two years.
- (2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer, the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period, terminate the service of the probationer.

- (3) After the completion of the period of probation, the appointing authority-
 - (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall, confirm him; and
- (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, terminate his service or extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate)

Explanation—The period of probation of a probationer shall be deemed to have been extended until any order under this sub-rule has been made.

No. S.R.O. 214-L/80/P(Sec-1)M-10/80-406.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the Post Office Act, 1898 (VI of 1898), the Government is pleased

to make the following further amendments in the Post Office Rules, 1961, namely:-

In the said Rules,-

- (1) in rule 3,-
 - (a) under the heading "LETTERS", for the words "Forty poisha" the words "Fifty poisha" shall be substituted;
 - (b) under the heading "Book, Pattern and Sample Packets",-
 - (i) under the sub-heading "Book Packets", for the words "Twenty-five poisha" and "Five poisha" the words "Thirty-five poisha" and "Ten poisha" shall respectively be substituted;
 - (ii) under the sub-heading "Pattern and Sample Packets", for the words "Twenty-five poisha" and "Ten poisha" the words "Thirty-five poisha" and "Fifteen poisha" shall respectively be substituted;
 - (c) under the heading "Registered Newspapers",-
 - (i) for the words "Ten poisha" the words "Fifteen poisha" shall be substituted; and
 - (ii) for the words "Five poisha", occurring for the second, third and fourth time, the words "Ten poisha" shall be substituted in all the places.
 - (d) under the heading "Blind Literature Packets", for the words "Two poisha" the words "Free" shall be substituted; and
 - (e) under the heading "Percels", for the words "Taka one" the words "Taka one and fifty poisha" shall be substituted;
- (2) in rule 4, in sub-rule (1),—
 - (a) for the words "Fifty poisha" against the entry "Inland Aero-gramme" the words "Seventy-five poisha" shall be substituted; and
 - (b) for the words "Taka one and Twenty-five poisha" against the entry "Air Parcels" the words "Taka two" shall be substituted; and
- (3) in rule 6,-
 - (a) under the heading "Business Reply Envelopes", for the words "fifty poisha" the word; "Seventy-five poisha" shall be substituted; and

- (b) under the heading "Business Reply Cards", for the words "Twenty-five poisha" the words "Thirty-five poisha" shall be substituted.
- 2. This notification shall take effect on the first day of July, 1980.
