No. S.R.O. 253-L/83/INE-2/83/D-I/444.—In pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the Chief Martial Law Administrator is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

**THE CATERING, CGO-II IN THE LOWER FORMATION OF
BANGLADESH ARMY RECRUITMENT RULES, 1983**

1. Short title.—These rules may be called the Catering, CGO-II in the Lower Formation of Bangladesh Army Recruitment Rules, 1983.

2. Definitions.—In these rules unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

- (a) “appointing authority” means the Government and includes any officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to the specified post;
- (b) “Board” means the Civilian Recruitment Board (Army) constituted by the Government;
- (c) “probationer” means a person appointed on probation to the specified post;

- (d) "recognised University" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by the Government, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission, to be a recognised University for the purpose of these rules;
- (e) "requisite qualification" in relation to the specified post, means the qualification laid down in the Schedule in relation to that post;
- (f) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules; and
- (g) "specified post" means the post specified in the Schedule.

3. Procedure for recruitment.—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule, appointment to the specified post shall be made by direct recruitment by the appointing authority.

(2) No person shall be appointed to the specified post unless he has the requisite qualification and is also within the age limit laid down in the Schedule.

4. Appointment by direct recruitment.—(1) No appointment to the specified post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Board.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to the specified post by direct recruitment, if he—

- (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh, or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in, Bangladesh; or
- (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to the specified post by direct recruitment shall be made until—

- (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director of Medical Service in the Army Headquarters, to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the specified post; and
- (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

(4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to the specified post unless—

- (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Board while inviting applications for the specified post; and
- (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, has applied through his official superior.

5. **Probation.**—(1) A person selected for appointment to the specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may for reasons to be recorded in writing extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

(2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer, the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may before the expiry of that period, terminate his service,

(3) After completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority,—

(a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (4), confirm him, and

(b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may terminate his service.

(4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in the specified post until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as the Government may, from time to time, prescribe by order.
