No. S.R.O. 328-L/80.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Press Council Act, 1974 (XXV of 1974), the Government is pleased to make the following rules, namely :—

THE PRESS COUNCIL RULES, 1980

1. **Short title.**—These rules may be called the Press Council Rules, 1980.
2. **Definitions.**—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—
 - (a) "Act" means the Press Council Act, 1974 (XXV of 1974);
 - (b) "Form" means a Form append to these rules;
 - (c) "Financial year" means the year commencing from the first day of July and ending on the 30th day of June; and
 - (d) "Section" means a section of the Act.
3. **Allowances of the members.**—A member of the Press Council shall—
 - (a) receive a sum of Taka 50 (Taka fifty) only for attending a meeting of the Council;
 - (b) be entitled to draw travelling allowance for a journey required for performing functions of the Council in the following manner :—
 - (i) actual fare of tourist class, if the journey is performed by air;

- (ii) highest class fare, if the journey is performed by railway or steamer; and
 - (iii) actual fare, if the journey is performed by bus; and
- (c) receive daily allowance at the rate of Taka 100 (Taka one hundred) only for each night halt in a place required to visit in connection with the functions of the Council.

4. Budget of the Council.—(1) The Council shall, at least three months prior to the commencement of each financial year, prepare its budget and forward two copies thereof to the Government for consideration and sanction as required by section 16.

(2) The budget statement shall be prepared showing—

- (a) estimated receipts from sources other than Government;
- (b) estimated expenditure during the financial year;
- (c) actual expenditure incurred during the previous financial year, that is, the year previous to the year to which the budget relates;
- (d) sums which are likely to be required from the Government during the financial year; and
- (e) detail estimated Head-wise expenditure of the total sums of the proposed budget.

(3) The matters at clauses (a), (b), (c) and (d) of sub-rule (2) shall be shown in Form 'A' and the matters specified at clause (e) of that sub-rule shall be shown in Form 'B'.

5. Annual report.—(1) The Council shall prepare once in every year an annual report giving a summary of its activities during the previous year and two copies thereof shall be forwarded to the Government within four months from the expiry of the year to which it relates.

(2) The annual report prepared under sub-rule (1) shall contain detail report of the activities discharged or functions performed in accordance with, and as required by, different provisions of the Act.

6. Maintenance of accounts.—(1) All sums of money received into, and spent from, the fund shall be entered into a register to be maintained for the purpose and every entry in the register shall be initialed by the Secretary of the Council or any officer authorised in this behalf by the Council.

(2) Records of all money received from the Government and all grants and advances made to the Council by any authority or person shall be maintained separately, indicating the sources with necessary reference as to sanction, etc.

(3) Receipts and vouchers of all expenditure incurred shall be preserved for audit purposes.

No. 442-Ansar.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission as required by clause (2) of article 140 of that Constitution, is pleased to make the following amendments in the Recruitment Rules for the posts of Gazetted Officers of Ansars published under Notification No. P10A-41/65(II)-141-PL, dated the 12th March, 1966, namely:—

In the aforesaid Rules,—

- (a) in rule 1, for the words "East Pakistan" the word "Bangladesh" shall be *substituted*;

(b) in rule 2,—

(i) for the words and commas "Director, Deputy Director, Assistant Director" the words and commas "Director-General, Director, Deputy Director" shall be *substituted*; and

(ii) the word "Provincial" shall be *omitted*;

(c) for rule 5 the following shall be *substituted*, namely:—

"5. Recruitment to the posts of Director-General and Director shall be made by the Government on the recommendation of the Superior Selection Board and recruitment to the posts of Deputy Director and District Adjutant shall be made by the Government on the recommendation of the Departmental Promotion Committee constituted for this purpose."

(d) for rule 6 the following shall be *substituted*, namely:—

"6. Recruitment to the post of Subdivisional Adjutant shall be made by the Government on the recommendation of the Bangladesh Public Service Commission."

(e) after rule 6, the following shall be *inserted*, namely:—

"6A. Appointment to the post of Circle Adjutant shall be made by the Director-General of Ansar, on the recommendation of the Bangladesh Public Service Commission."

(f) in rule 8,—

(i) for the words "Director of Ansars" the word "Government" shall be *substituted*;

(ii) for the word "him" the word "it" shall be *substituted*; and

(iii) for the words "Services and General Administration Department through the "Administrative Department concerned" the words "President through the Establishment Division" shall be *substituted*;

(g) for rule 10 the following shall be *substituted*, namely:—

"10. A candidate selected for direct appointment shall be required to undergo a prescribed course of training for such period as may be determined by the Government from time to time."

(h) in rule 12, for the words "within the period of three months" the words "within the period determined under rule 10" shall be *substituted*;

(i) in rule 13, for the words and comma "Public Service Commission, East Pakistan" the words "Bangladesh Public Service Commission" shall be *substituted*;

(j) in rule 15,—

(i) for the word "Pakistan" occurring twice the word "Bangladesh" shall be *substituted*;

- (ii) for the words "East Pakistan" the word "Bangladesh" shall be substituted; and
- (iii) for the word "Governor" the word "President" shall be substituted;
- (k) in rule 16, for the words, brackets and comma "Home (Political) Department, Government of East Pakistan" the words "Ministry of Home Affairs" shall be substituted;
- (l) in rule 17,—
- (i) for the word "East Pakistan" the word "Bangladesh" shall be substituted; and
- (ii) for the word "Pakistan" the word "Bangladesh" shall be substituted; and
- (m) for the Schedule the following shall be substituted, namely:—
