NOTIFICATION

No. S.R.O. 346-L/76/FP/S-3/45/76/414.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President is pleased to make the following rules, namely:

1. **Short title**—These rules may be called the Family Planning Assistants and Family Welfare Assistants Recruitment Rules, 1976.

2. **Definitions**.—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

(a) "appointing authority" means the Director General, Department of Population Control and Family Planning and includes, in relation to specified post or class of such posts, any officer authorised by him to make appointment to such post or class of posts;

(b) "recognised Board" means a Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other Board declared by the Government to be a recognised Board for the purposes of these rules;

- (c) "requisite qualification", in relation to a specified post, means the qualification laid down in the Schedule in relation to that post;
- (d) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules;
- (f) "Union" means an area declared to be a union under the Bangladesh Local Government (Union Parishad and Paurashava) Order, 1973 (P. O. No. 22 of 1973).

3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule, appointment to a specified post shall be made by direct recruitment.

(2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has the requisite qualification and is also within the age limit laid down in the Schedule for that post:

Provided that in the case of a person who is already in the service of the Republic, the age limit may be relaxed by five years.

4. **Special provision regarding recruitment of Family Planning Assistant (Junior).**—There shall not be any appointment of a Family Planning Assistant (Junior) for any Union:

Provided that Family Planning Assistant (Junior) may be appointed for a Union in the Chittagong Hill Tracts if the appointing authority is of opinion that no person for appointment as Family Planning Assistant (Senior) is available in that Union.

5. **Appointment.**—(1) No appointment to a specified post shall be made by the appointing authority except upon the recommendation of the Selection Committee constituted by the Government for the purpose.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post if he is not a citizen of Bangladesh, or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in, Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to a specified post shall be made until—

- (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a medical officer competent to issue medical certificate in terms of rule 14 of the Service Rules, Part I, to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the specified post; and
- (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through the appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

PROCLAMATIONS

WHEREAS it has been made to appear to me that (1) Mr Abu Taher Bhuyan, s/o. Shafiuddin Bhuyan of Basail Bhog, P.S. Sreenagar, Dist. Dacca and (2) Kazi Abul Kashem, s/o. late Kazi Md. Akmal of Sarkarpara, Gokarna Road, P.S. Brahmanbaria, Dist. Comilla, is required for the purpose of trial in the Special Martial Law Court No. I, Ganabhaban, Sher-E-Bangla Nagar, Dacca—15, under Regulation 3(2) of the Martial Law Regulation No. I of 1975;

AND whereas this court has reason to believe that the said accused Abu Taher Bhuyan and Kazi Abul Kashem are absconding or concealing themselves to avoid appearance or arrest for the said purpose;

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by Regulation 3(7) of the Martial Law Regulation No. I, of 1975 this Special Martial Law Court No. I, Ganabhaban, Sher-E-Bangla Nagar, Dacca—15, do hereby direct—

Abu Taher Bhuyan and Kazi Abul Kashem to appear in this Court at Ganabhaban, Sher-E-Bangla Nagar, Dacca—15, on 21-10-76 at 10-00 a.m. in the Martial Law Case No. 48 of 1976 failing which they will be tried *in absentia* and their properties may be forfeited to the Government.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear to me that Mr Abu Zafar Bhuiya, son of Shafiuddin Bhuiya of Basail Bhog, P.S. Sreenagar, Dacca, is required for the purpose of trial in the Special Martial Law Court No. I, Ganabhaban, Sher-E-Bangla Nagar, Dacca—15, under Regulation 3(2) of the Martial Law Regulation No. I of 1975;

AND, whereas this court has reason to believe that the said accused Mr Abu Zafar Bhuiya is absconding or concealing himself to avoid appearance or arrest for the said purpose;

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by Regulation 3(7) of the Martial Law Regulation No. I of 1975 this Special Martial Law Court No. I, Ganabhaban, Dacca, do hereby direct—

Mr Abu Zafar Bhuiya to appear in this Court at Ganabhaban, Sher-E-Bangla Nagar, Dacca, on 22-10-1976 at 10 a.m. in the Martial Law Case No. 49 of 1976 failing which he will be tried *in absentia* and his properties may be forfeited to the Government.
