No. S.R.O. 354-L/82.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 5 of the Land Development Tax Ordinance, 1976 (XLII of 1976), the Government is pleased to make the following amendment in the Land Development Tax Rules, 1976, namely:—

In the aforesaid Rules,—

- (a) in rule 3, in sub-rule (2), *after* the word “thereof” the following shall be *inserted*, namely:—

“and require the head of each family or ‘body’ to submit to him a statement showing the land held by him and all other members of his family or body anywhere in Bangladesh in the Form annexed to these rules”;

- (b) *after* rule 3, amended as aforesaid, the following new rule shall be *inserted*, namely:—

“3A. Provisional collection of taxes.—Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules, taxes leviable under the Ordinance shall be

collected provisionally on the basis of statement submitted under sub-rule (2) of rule 3 by each head of 'family' or 'body.';

(c) after rule 9B, the following new rule shall be inserted, namely:—

“9C. Change of quantity of land.—On receipt of an application from the head of a family or body, the Revenue Officer, if satisfied after making such enquiry as he thinks necessary, may revise the assessment roll for changing the quantity of land held by a family or body.”; and

(d) after rule 10, the following Form shall be added, namely:—

No. S.R.O. 356-L/82/S-III/M-25/82/880.—In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (a) of section 32 of the Paurashava Ordinance, 1977 (Ord. XXVI of 1977), the Government is pleased to transfer the management and control of Water Supply and Sanitation Service along with their staff maintained by the Paurashava of Barisal, Bogra, Jessore, Comilla and Mymensingh to the management and control of the Department of Public Health Engineering on the following terms and conditions, namely:—

- (i) Responsibility for operation and maintenance of urban water supply and sanitation in the 5(five) District Towns concerned shall be vested with Department of Public Health Engineering for 3 (three) years after completion of the project in terms of the Loan Agreement between the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh and the Asian Development Bank signed on July 28, 1982;
- (ii) Responsibility for determination, imposition and collection of all taxes, levies and charges in respect of urban water supply and sanitation facilities in the project areas shall be vested with the Department of Public Health Engineering;
- (iii) A separate water supply and sanitation account shall be established in each of the 5(five) Paurashavas which would be operated jointly by the Chairman of the concerned Paurashava and the Executive Engineer, DPHE District Office;
- (iv) The staff of the concerned Paurashavas working in connection with urban water supply and sanitation activities shall remain under the administrative control of Department of Public Health Engineering for 3 (three) years. They shall work under the guidance and supervision of the Department of Public Health Engineering. The Paurashava authority will take necessary disciplinary action against the concerned staff on the report of the Department of Public Health Engineering;
- (v) The Paurashava staff who shall work for the execution and maintenance of water supply and sanitation activities under the Department of Public Health Engineering shall receive their pay, allowances, etc.,

from the new head of Account to be jointly operated by the Chairman of the Paurashava and Executive Engineer, DPHE District Office concerned.

No. S.R.O. 357-L/82.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Imports and Exports (Control) Act, 1950 (XXXIX of 1950), the Government is pleased to make the following further amendments in the Licences and Permits Fees Order, 1958, namely :—

In the aforesaid Order,—

- (1) in paragraph 3, for sub-paragraph (2), the following shall be substituted, namely :—

“(2) In the cases where a letter of credit is required to be opened, a receipted treasury chalan showing the payment of fee on the value of the letter of credit shall be submitted by the importer to the bank concerned, without which the bank shall not open the letter of credit. In the cases where import takes place on a basis other than the letter of credit, a receipted treasury chalan showing the payment of fee shall be submitted to the licensing authority alongwith other documents for issue of import permit or clearance permit.” ; and

- (2) in paragraph 5, in sub-paragraph (12), for the full-stop at the end a semi-colon shall be substituted and thereafter the following new sub-paragraphs (13), (14) and (15) shall be added, namely :—

“(13) for import of capital machinery and spares for industrialisation of the areas other than those falling within the following police-stations, namely :—

- (a) Kotwali, Sutrapur, Lalbag, Dhanmondi, Ramna, Motijheel, Tejgaon, Demra, Cantonment, Gulshan, Mirpur, Mohammadpur, Keraniganj, Joydevpur, Tongi, Narayangonj, Fatullah, Siddhirganj, Bandar, Savar, Narshingdi and Kaligonj of Dacca district ;



- (b) Kotwali, Doublemooring, Chittagong Port, Panch laish, Hathazari, Sitakunda, Rangunia and Raozan of Chittagong district ; and
- (c) Khulna, Daulatpur and Phultala of Khulna district ;
- (14) for import of machinery for export oriented industries ;
- (15) for import of trawlers, factory ships and other mechanised vessels for export oriented fish catching industries.

*Explanation.*—In this Order, the expressions “export oriented industries” and “export oriented fish catching industries” shall include such industries which have commitment for export of at least 80% of their annual production to foreign countries”.

2. This Order shall be deemed to have come into force on the first day of July, 1982.
