Dhaka, the 18th October 1982

No. SRO.362-L/S-IX/SE-5/82.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Shops and Establishments Act, 1965 (E.P. Act VII of 1965), the Government is pleased to suspend the operation of the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 4 and clause (a) of section 10 of the said Act in respect of the offices of the Bangladesh Employers' Association and its member commercial establishments for a period of one year, subject to the following conditions, namely:—

- (a) every worker employed in any such office or establishment shall be allowed two days' consecutive holidays in each week; and
- (b) every such worker shall be allowed an interval of at least half an hour during each working day for rest or meal.
