No. S.R.O. 401-L/75/IF. V/49/74-788.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Article 15 of the Bangladesh Coinage Order, 1972 (P.O. No. 83 of 1972) read with Article 6 thereof, the Government is pleased to make the following rule, namely:—

The standard weight of one Taka coins, coined under the provisions of Article 4 of the said order and the remedy allowed in the making of such coins shall be as specified below:

No. S.R.O. 402-L/75/HF.V/49/74-789.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Article 4 of the Bangladesh Coinage Order, 1972 (P. O. No. 83 of 1972), the Government is pleased to determine that coins of the denomination of 1 Taka hereafter to be coined at the Mint for issue under the authority of the Government shall conform to the following dimensions, design and composition, namely:—

DIMENSIONS AND METAL.

1 Taka	Cupro-nickel (75% copper, 25% nickel).	26.00 mm	Round	Milled with 140 serrations.

DESIGNS

Obverse.

Obverse of 1 Taka coin shall comprise of an elevated outer rim with the National Emblem placed inside it. The National Emblem consists of the national flower 'Shapla' (nymphaea nouchali) resting on water (5 waves) having on each side an ear of paddy and being surmounted by three connected leaves of jute with two stars on each side of the leaves.

Reverse.

The Reverse of the coin shall comprise of an elevated outer rim with a series of small hemispheric dot patters running along side the rim in a circle. The main design shall comprise of 4 human figures, on the left side of which shall appear an ear of paddy with a leaf. On the right side of the main design shall appear the denominational value of the coin, viz., One Taka in Bengali with the Bengali numeral 'One' placed in between the inscriptions in Bengali of the word 'Bangladesh', the year 1975, or 1976 or 1977 shall appear on top and below respectively of the four human figures. The slogan "পরিকল্পিত পরিবার—সবার জন্য খাদ্য" (planned family—food for all) shall also appear in a semi-circular form on the lower-half of the coin.

All the lettering and numerals shall be in Bengali. All the above features shall be executed in reasonably high relief.

No. S.R.O. 404-L/75/IF. (5)/31/75-Pt. 8/235.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Hundred-Taka Demonetised Notes (Mode of Payment and Recovery of Taxes) Act, 1975 (XXXV of 1975), the Government is pleased to direct that until further directions in this behalf, the value of the demonetised notes deposited shall, to the extent mentioned below, be paid in the following manner, namely:—

- (1) In the case of the depositors mentioned in the schedule below, the full value of the notes shall, unless earlier paid, be paid in cash on any day the depositors may demand the payment.
- (2) In the case of other depositors, value of the notes to the extent of Taka eight thousand shall be paid in cash in two instalments, the first instalment of Taka five thousand to be paid, unless earlier paid, on any day after the date of this Notification; and the second instalment of the remaining sum to be paid on any day after the 1st December, 1975.

No. S.R.O. 403-L/75/S-VII/1(46)/75.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Shops and Establishments Act, 1965 (E.P. Act VII of 1965), the Government is pleased to suspend the operation of the provisions of sections 4, 8, 10 and 11 of the said Act in respect of the establishments, named below, for a period of six months beginning on the 1st day of November, 1975, to the 30th day of April, 1976, subject to the following conditions namely:—

- (a) the workers required to work overtime shall be paid wages at double the rate of ordinary wages for working beyond the normal working hours; and
- (b) the workers deprived of weekly holidays shall be allowed compensatory weekly holidays within a month after the 30th day of April, 1976.
