No. S.R.O. 436-L/82.—In pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the Chief Martial Law Administrator is pleased to make the following amendment in the Non-Gazetted Employees (Special Branch and District Special Branch) Recruitment Rules, 1979, namely:—

In the aforesaid Rules, in rule 5, for sub-rule (1), the following shall be substituted, namely:—

“(1) Appointment by promotion to a specified post shall be made by the appointing authority on the recommendation of such Departmental Promotion Committee as may be constituted in this behalf”.

No. S.R.O. 437-L/82.—In pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the Chief Martial Law Administrator is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

1. Short title.—These rules may be called the Librarian (Police Academy, Sardah) Recruitment Rules, 1982.

2. **Definitions.**—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

- (a) “appointing authority” means the Government and includes, any officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to the post;
- (b) “Commission” means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
- (c) “post” means the post of Librarian in the Police Academy, Sardah;
- (d) “probationer” means a person appointed on probation to the post; and
- (e) “recognised University” means an University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other university declared by the Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised university for the purpose of these rules.

3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(1) Appointment to the post shall be made by direct recruitment.

(2) No person shall be appointed to the post unless he holds the Bachelor's Degree in Library Science from a recognised university or the Bachelor's Degree from that university with Diploma in Library Science and he is also within the age limit not exceeding 25 years.

4. **Appointment.**—(1) No appointment to the post shall be made except on the recommendation of the Commission.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to the post if he—

- (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in Bangladesh;
- (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to the post shall be made until—

- (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Officer competent to issue medical certificates in terms of rule 14 of the Service Rules, Part I, to be fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post; and
- (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to the post unless—

- (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date as was notified by the Commission while inviting application for the post; and
- (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he applied through his official superior.

5. **Probation.**—(1) A person selected for appointment to the post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

(2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer the appointing authority is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period, terminate his service.

(3) After the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority—

(a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (4), confirm him; and

(b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period has not been satisfactory, may terminate his service.

(4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in the post until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as the Government may, from time to time, direct.

No. S.R.O. 438-L/82.—In pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the Chief Martial Law Administrator, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

1. **Short title.**—These rules may be called the Assistant Tele-Communication Officer Recruitment Rules, 1982.

2. **Definitions.**—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

(a) “appointing authority” means the Government or any officer authorised by the Government;

(b) “probationer” means a person appointed on probation to a post of Assistant Tele-Communication Officer;

(c) “post” means the post of Assistant Tele-Communication Officer;

(d) “requisite qualification” means the qualification laid down in the Schedule in relation to the post; and

(e) “schedule” means the Schedule to these rules.

3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule, appointment to the post shall be made—

(a) by promotion; or

(b) by direct recruitment; or

(c) by transfer of service.

2. No person shall be appointed to the post unless he has the requisite qualification and in the case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age limit laid down in the Schedule.

4. Appointment by direct recruitment.—(1) No person shall be appointed to the post except upon the recommendation of a Selection Board consisting of the Inspector-General or Additional Inspector-General of Police as Chairman, one Deputy Inspector General as Member and Assistant Inspector-General, Tele-Communication, as Member/Secretary.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to the post by direct recruitment, if he—

(a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in, Bangladesh;

(b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to the post by direct recruitment shall be made until—

(a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director General of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post; and

(b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

(4) No person shall be appointed to the post unless—

(a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Inspector-General of Police inviting applications for the post; and

(b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he applied through his official superior.

5. Appointment by promotion.—(1) Subject to the provision of the Schedule, appointment by promotion to the post shall be made on the recommendation of the Selection Board constituted under rule 4.

6. Probation.—(1) Persons selected for appointment to the post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation—

(a) in the case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and

(b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

(2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer, the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period,—

- (a) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service;
- (b) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

(3) After the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority,—

- (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (4), confirm him; and
- (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may,—

- (i) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service; and
- (ii) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

(4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in a post until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as the Government may, from time to time, direct.
